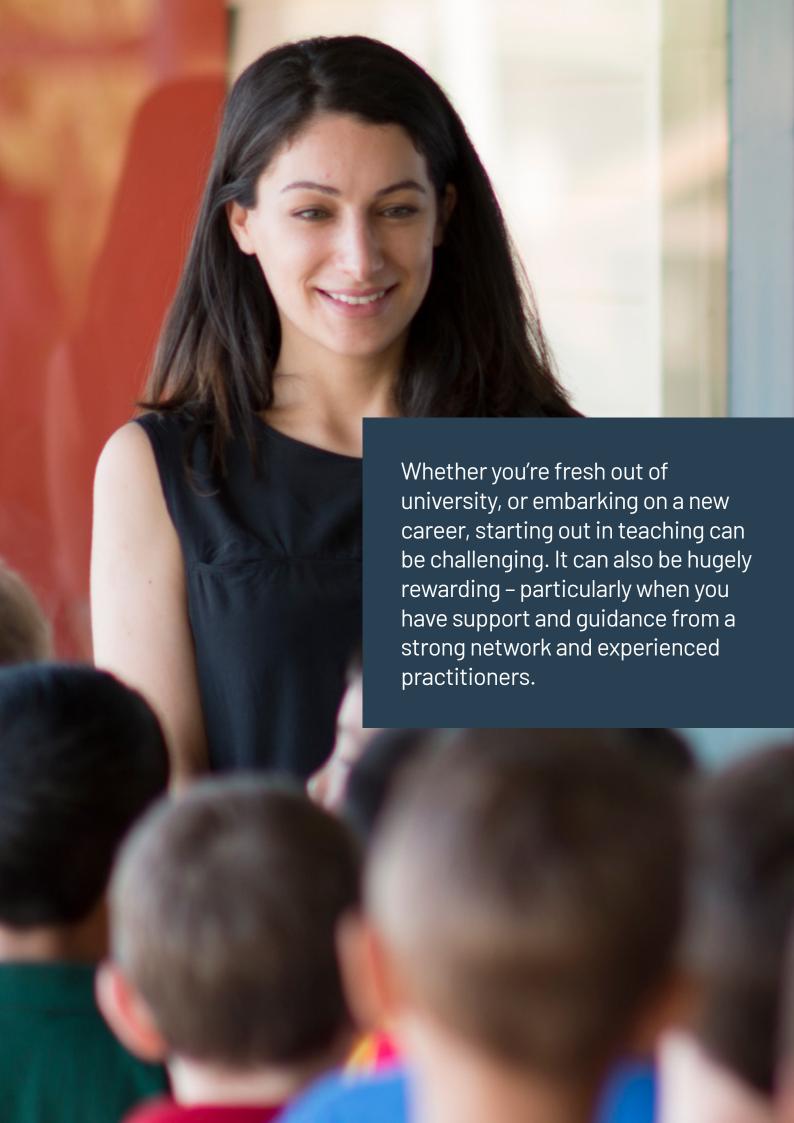

# Equip yourself for long-term success

## Supporting teachers, supporting schools

Well-trained and knowledgeable teachers provide the foundation for a strong, high quality education system focused on improving student outcomes. While this is well understood by educators, evidence shows that significant numbers of beginning teachers leave the profession after two to three years.

ISV's Beginning Teachers Program will support your school to:

- Improve the quality of induction and ongoing mentoring at your school
- Empower your new teachers with a community of practice
- Develop and retain quality teachers for your school.

Effectiveness of induction programs improve as the range of supports and strategies provided increase. According to the 'Australian guidelines for teacher induction into the profession' (AITSL 2018), the best induction programs include practice-focused mentoring, leadership contact, participation in collaborative networks, targeted professional learning, observation and reflection on teaching, practical information and time allocation.

The support you receive generally influences how effectively you perform in your first year and how competent a teacher you eventually become. Well mentored and well supported early career teachers are more likely to develop into skilled practitioners who are keen to engage in ongoing learning to build their capacity as teachers and, in some cases, as school leaders.

ISV's Beginning Teachers Program aims to give new teachers the best possible start to their career to develop their confidence and thrive in the classroom. It also supports schools to develop and retain quality teachers for the long-term.

Participants are paired with an experienced ISV consultant, who provide ongoing mentoring and in-school support for the first year in the classroom. You will also develop your network with a cohort of beginning teachers from other Independent schools.

- Gain access to a supportive network of new teachers from other schools.

## **Program**

The program commences in Term 1 of each year, however beginning teachers may opt-in at any point throughout the year.

In addition to the main program, Beginning teachers can participate in optional classroom observation and receive feedback from an ISV consultant.
